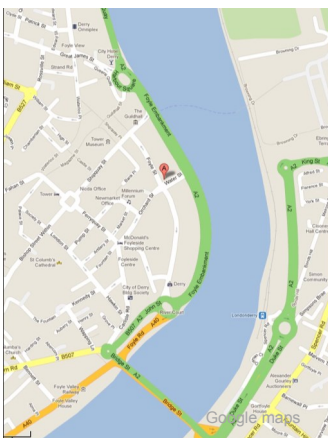

**IRISH AND LOCAL HISTORY** collection is situated in Derry Central Library on the first floor and contains material that is mainly non borrowable reference only: however there is an extensive borrowable collection with copies of many of the titles.

### Bookstock

The collection covers all aspects of Irish life from the earliest times to the present day. Specific emphasis is given to Ulster and in particular County Derry / Londonderry and Donegal. Publications by local authors and locally published items are collected and archived for future generations.

### Journals/Periodicals

A significant number of historic and current journals are held and can be viewed in the department. The Ulster Journal of Archaeology, Waterside Voices, Fingerpost Community Mirror, An Tultach, Capuchan, and The Furrow, to name but a few, are all available for consultation.

### Newspapers

The collection comprises of local County Derry / Londonderry newspapers available in bound copy or on microfilm. A microfilm reader may need to be booked to view the newspaper collection.

### Maps

The map collection consists of the siege of Derry and Plantation maps of Derry. Ordnance Survey county series maps are held from 1830. Ordnance Survey town plans are held from 1873.

### Cuttings files

A range of packs / Newspaper files are available on people, places and events of local interest.

### Photographs

Extensive Bigger McDonald collection of photographs of local interest is available to browse. These can also be purchased.

### Postcards

Historic and Political postcards from the local area.

### Pamphlets

Some pamphlets of local interest.

### Directories

The Derry Almanac, a long but incomplete run from 1871 – 1953 and various Trade directories.

### Special Collections

Troubles collection, the Bloody Sunday Enquiry and assorted Donegal Inishowen books.

### Tours and talks

Visits are welcomed from groups, societies and schools and staff are available to speak about the heritage collection and the wide range of local materials in the archives.

### Exhibitions and events

The library welcomes exhibitions and events. It is advisable to book in advance as space is limited.
