Participation in Core & Regular Library Activities in Northern Ireland 2014/15

Summary

From 1 April 2014 – 31 March 2015:

- A total of 309,756 participants (109,955 adults and 199,801 children) engaged in 20,386 core and regular activity sessions run by Libraries NI this is an increase of 3% in both the number of participants and activity sessions since 2013/14 (302,117 participants and 19,818 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13 as information was only recorded for core activities in this year information on regular activities was included from 2013/14.
 - 273,512 participants (73,711 adults and 199,801 children) engaged in 15,848 core activity sessions (i.e. Class visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime) this is an increase of 1% in participant numbers and a 1% decrease in the number of core activity sessions since 2013/14 (272,111 participants and 15,974 sessions respectively), but a 24% increase in the number of participants (221,109) and a 22% increase in the number of sessions (12,993) since 2012/13.
 - o 36,244 adults engaged in 4,538 regular activity sessions (i.e. Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups) this is a 21% increase in the number of participants and an 18% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (30,006 participants and 3,844 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Core Activities

- 95,815 children took part in the school class visits programme (3,896 sessions), a decrease of 7% in both the number of children and sessions since 2013/14 (103,185 children and 4,208 sessions respectively). However, this is a 10% increase in the number of children (86,880) and a 9% increase in the number of sessions (3,583) since 2012/13.
- 3,028 adults participated in 2,781 Got IT? sessions, compared to 3,294 adults and 3,085 sessions in 2013/14. This is a decrease of 8% in the number of adults and a decrease of 10% in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, this is a 26% increase in the number of adults (2,407) and a 20% increase in the number of sessions (2,312) since 2012/13.
- 13,792 participants engaged in 1,893 reading group sessions, a 10% decrease in the number of participants and a 5% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (15,307 participants and 2,001 sessions respectively), but a 19% increase in the number of participants (11,544) and a 25% increase in the number of sessions (1,512) since 2012/13.
 - 10,111 adults took part in 1,263 reading group sessions, compared to 10,472 adults and 1,268 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 3% *decrease* in the number of adults and almost no change in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, it represents a 28% increase in the number of adults (7,876) and a 36% increase in the number of sessions (927) since 2012/13.

- 3,681 children took part in 630 reading group sessions, compared to 4,835 children and 733 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 24% decrease in the number of children and a 14% decrease in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, there is almost no change in the number of children (3,668) and an 8% increase in the number of sessions (585) since 2012/13.
- 140,027 participants (60,572 adults and 79,455 children) engaged in a total of 5,100 Rhythm and Rhyme sessions for pre-school age children (0-4 years), an 11% increase in the number of participants and a 15% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (126,280 participants and 4,431 sessions respectively). This is also an increase of 40% in the number of participants (100,156) and a 41% increase in the number of sessions (3,608) since 2012/13.
- 20,850 children engaged in a total of 2,178 Storytime sessions for 4-8 year olds, a 13% *decrease* in the number of children and a 3% *decrease* in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (24,045 children and 2,249 sessions respectively). However, it represents a 4% increase in the number of children (20,122) and a 10% increase in the number of sessions (1,978) since 2012/13.

Regular Activities

- 1,285 adults took part in 207 genealogy (i.e. family history) activities in 2014/15.
 This is an 11% increase in the number of adults and a 25% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (1,156 adults and 165 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.
- 2,655 adults participated in 447 Go ON! small group sessions compared to 1,757 adults and 331 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 51% increase in the number of adults and a 35% increase in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.
- 4,159 adults engaged in 789 Job Club sessions, compared to 3,967 adults and 651 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 5% increase in the number of adults and a 21% increase in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.
- 28,145 adults participated in 3,095 Knit and Natter group sessions in 2014/15. This is an increase of 22% in the number of adults and an increase of 15% in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (23,126 adults and 2,697 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Background

The Northern Ireland Library Authority (Libraries NI) was established in April 2009 as a result of the Review of Public Administration. Libraries NI has the statutory responsibility for the provision of public library services in Northern Ireland and its functions are laid down in the Libraries Act (Northern Ireland) 2008. It is a Non Departmental Public Body which reports to the Department of Culture, Arts and Leisure.

Libraries NI provides a number of core and regular activities in the majority of its 96 branch libraries as part of its programmes to promote reading, learning and access to culture, heritage and information. Core activities are defined as Class Visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime, while Regular activities are defined as Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups.

Definitions

Core Activities

Class Visits

The Class Visits programme is open to all Northern Ireland nursery, primary, post primary and special needs schools and aims to give pupils an insight into the range of services available at their local library, and to encourage them to become members. Classes can come to the library for book exchange, storytelling, craft sessions, to use computers etc.

Within the Class Visits programme, there is a set of activities specifically aimed at primary school age children in Years 4 and 6 and supports Key Stage 1 and 2 language and literacy skills as detailed in the NI Curriculum. This element of the programme offers a series of 3 one hour visits for pupils in these year groups which include a general introduction and tour of the library, activities to help explain the layout of library stock and instruction on the various uses of computers in the library. One-off visits are also available which give pupils a general overview of library services and resources. At the end of each visit, the pupils will listen to a story and there will be an opportunity for them to browse and exchange books.

Libraries NI staff have also begun outreach visits to many schools to promote the various library services and read stories to the pupils.

Got IT?

Got IT? is a free programme to support people with little or no knowledge of computers and help them develop basic IT skills. The programme is aimed at adults and delivered by Libraries NI staff on a one-to-one or small group basis, with sessions covering the following topics:

- Introduction to computers;
- Introduction to the Internet:
- Introduction to email.

Reading Groups

Reading groups cater for both children and adults and encourage people to read for pleasure, read adventurously, share their enthusiasm about books and develop the confidence to formulate and express opinions about reading.

Libraries NI staff host reading groups for adults and children/teenagers, including those aimed at specific groups in society (e.g. visually impaired, deaf etc.). Reading groups hosted by external organisations that meet in the library premises and use library resources are also facilitated. A new flexible type of children's reading group called Chatterbooks, run in conjunction with The Reading Agency was introduced in libraries in 2014/15. Sessions are suitable for 7-11 year olds of all different abilities.

Rhythm and Rhyme

Rhythm and Rhyme is a free programme of stories, rhymes and songs delivered on a regular or seasonal basis by Libraries NI staff (or held in partnership with SureStart¹) for parents, carers and pre-school children (aged 0-4 years). The aim of the programme is to improve children's language and communication skills before they enter formal education.

In addition to sessions that are open to the public, the programme is also available to young children attending day nurseries, playgroups, parent and toddler groups etc. These dedicated sessions are mostly held on the library premises but some are also delivered by Libraries NI staff at external locations (e.g. on playgroup premises, at community centres etc.). On occasions, public sessions are also delivered at external locations as part of community festivals etc.

Storytime

Storytime is a free programme of stories, rhymes and poems delivered on a regular or seasonal basis by Libraries NI staff for children aged 4-8 years.

In addition to sessions that are open to the public, the programme is also available to external organisations attended by children of an equivalent age range (e.g. Rainbows/Cygnets/Brigíní (Girl Guides), Beavers (Boy Scouts), Explorers (Girls' Brigade), Anchor Boys (Boys' Brigade) or after school day care facilities etc.). Such dedicated sessions are mostly held on the library premises but some are also delivered by Libraries NI staff at other locations (e.g. at community centres, church/parish halls etc. or to groups of children who are unable to come to the library, e.g. those in hospice care). On occasions, public sessions are also delivered at external locations as part of community festivals etc.

¹ SureStart is a government led initiative aimed at giving every child the best possible start in life and which offers a broad range of services including Early Years Care and Education to children aged 4 years and under.

Regular Activities

Genealogy

Genealogy is also known as family history and Libraries NI holds various related free activities for adults including talks, presentations and Ancestry Library Edition workshops. Ancestry Library Edition is an online resource which can be accessed free of charge in all libraries within the Libraries NI network (i.e. it is not available to use from external locations such as homes, offices etc.) and people attending the workshops can use it, with the support of Libraries NI staff where required, to search a range of online records. These include census records which are a vital source of information for people researching their family history and allow them to discover the name, age, birth place, occupation, address etc. of their ancestors.

Go ON!

Go ON! is a free programme to support people who are able to use a computer, email and the Internet and want to further develop their IT skills with regard to everyday computer tasks, such as paying utility bills or shopping online, online banking, social networking, digital photography, online health enquiries etc. The programme is aimed at adults and modules are delivered by Libraries NI staff on a small group basis.

Job Clubs

Job Clubs are held in partnership with the Department of Employment and Learning (DEL) on library premises, offering free internet access and other library services to adults who are unemployed. They give people an opportunity to develop their IT skills using the library's computers and participants receive assistance with job hunting, online applications, preparing CVs and interview practice.

Other organisations (e.g. Job Assist, Kickstart to Work, Supported Employment Solutions etc.) also use the library facilities to offer similar advice and services to the unemployed and are therefore included in the 2014/15 figures.

Knit and Natter Groups

Knit and Natter groups are held in various libraries across Northern Ireland and are for adults who enjoy knitting, crochet, cross stitch and other crafts. They are free of charge and participants have the opportunity to share hints and tips, swap patterns, meet new people and learn new skills and can bring along whatever they are already working on or start a new project.


Libraries NI Activity Database

This bulletin presents information on participation in the aforementioned core and regular library activities during 2014/15, collected via the Libraries NI Activity Database which was established in April 2012. During 2012/13 the database collected information on core activities only but was extended to also capture information on regular activities from 2013/14.

Findings


- During 2014/15, a total of 309,756 participants (109,955 adults and 199,801 children) engaged in 20,386 core and regular activity sessions run by Libraries NI this is an increase of 3% in both the number of participants and activity sessions since 2013/14 (302,117 participants and 19,818 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13 as information was only recorded for core activities in this year information on regular activities was included from 2013/14.
- 273,512 participants (73,711 adults and 199,801 children) engaged in 15,848 core activity sessions (i.e. Class visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime) this is an increase of 1% in participant numbers and a 1% decrease in the number of core activity sessions since 2013/14 (272,111 participants and 15,974 sessions respectively), but a 24% increase in the number of participants (221,109) and a 22% increase in the number of sessions (12,993) since 2012/13.





o 36,244 adults engaged in 4,538 regular activity sessions (i.e. Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups) – this is a 21% increase in the number of participants and an 18% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (30,006 participants and 3,844 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Figure 2: Regular Activities




Core Activities

Class Visits

During 2014/15, 95,815 children took part in the school class visits programme (3,896 sessions), a decrease of 7% in both the number of children and sessions since 2013/14 (103,185 children and 4,208 sessions respectively). However, this is a 10% increase in the number of children (86,880) and a 9% increase in the number of sessions (3,583) since 2012/13.

Figure 3: Class Visits




- o 13,450 were pupils from nursery schools or primary schools with an associated nursery unit (502 sessions 267 of which were outreach sessions held on school premises). This represents a 20% increase in the number of children and a 26% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (11,228 children and 399 sessions respectively). This is also an 81% increase in the number of children (7,418) and almost double the number of sessions (252) since 2012/13.
- 81,330 were pupils from primary or special needs schools (3,338 sessions), a 10% decrease in the number of children and an 11% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (90,211 children and 3,739 sessions respectively). However, this is a 4% increase in the number of children (78,520) and a 3% increase in the number of sessions (3,247) since 2012/13.
 - 35,815 participated in a set of structured activities aimed at pupils in Year 4 & Year 6 to support Key Stage 1 & 2 of the NI curriculum with regard to language and literacy skills (1,448 sessions), a 17% decrease in the number of children and an 18% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (43,108 children and 1,775 sessions respectively). The number of children is fairly similar to that in 2012/13 (35,966) but this is a 2% decrease in the number of sessions (1,480) since then.
 - The remaining 45,515 exchanged books and/or listened to stories, took part in crafts etc. (1,890 sessions 116 of which were outreach sessions held on school premises), which represents a 4% *decrease* in the number of children and a 3% *decrease* in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (47,103 children and 1,964 sessions respectively). However, this is a 7% increase in both the number of children (42,554) and sessions (1,767) since 2012/13.
- 1,035 were pupils from post primary schools (56 sessions), a 41% decrease in the number of children and a 20% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (1,746 children and 70 sessions respectively). However, this is a 10% increase in the number of children (942) and a 33% decrease in the number of sessions (84) since 2012/13.

Got IT?

3,028 adults participated in 2,781 Got IT? sessions in 2014/15, compared to 3,294 adults and 3,085 sessions in 2013/14. This is a *decrease* of 8% in the number of adults and a *decrease* of 10% in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, this is a 26% increase in the number of adults (2,407) and a 20% increase in the number of sessions (2,312) since 2012/13.

Figure 4: Got IT?




- 2,641 adults took part on a one-to-one basis compared to 2,936 in 2013/14, a decrease of 10%. However, this is an increase of 18% in the number of adults (2,243) since 2012/13.
- 387 adults participated in 140 small group sessions, which represents an 8% increase in the number of adults (358) and a 6% decrease in the number of sessions (149) since 2013/14. However, this is more than double both the number of adults (164) and sessions (69) since 2012/13.

Reading Groups

 During 2014/15, 13,792 participants engaged in 1,893 reading group sessions, a 10% decrease in the number of participants and a 5% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (15,307 participants and 2,001 sessions respectively), but a 19% increase in the number of participants (11,544) and a 25% increase in the number of sessions (1,512) since 2012/13.

- 10,111 adults took part in 1,263 reading group sessions, compared to 10,472 adults and 1,268 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 3% decrease in the number of adults and almost no change in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, this is a 28% increase in the number of adults (7,876) and a 36% increase in the number of sessions (927) since 2012/13.
- o 3,681 children took part in 630 reading group sessions, compared to 4,835 children and 733 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 24% decrease in the number of children and a 14% decrease in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. However, the number of children is almost the same (3,668) as in 2012/13 and there is an 8% increase in the number of sessions (585) since then.
 - 750 children took part in 105 Chatterbooks sessions for 7-11 year olds. This is the first year information was recorded for this type of reading group so there are no corresponding figures for 2012/13 or 2013/14.
 - 751 children took part in 126 sessions for 7-9 year olds, a 50% decrease in the number of children and a 36% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (1,508 children and 196 sessions respectively). This is also a 28% decrease in the number of children (1,041) and a 15% decrease in the number of sessions (148) since 2012/13.
 - 1,581 children took part in 294 sessions for 9-11 year olds, a 34% decrease in the number of children and a 25% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (2,395 children and 393 sessions respectively). This is also a 14% decrease in the number of children (1,847) and an 8% decrease in the number of sessions (321) since 2012/13.
 - 599 children took part in 105 sessions for those aged 12+ years, a 36% decrease in the number of children and a 27% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (932 children and 144 sessions respectively). This is also a 23% decrease in the number of children (780) and a 9% decrease in the number of sessions (116) since 2012/13.

Rhythm and Rhyme

- During 2014/15, 140,027 participants (60,572 adults and 79,455 children) engaged in a total of 5,100 Rhythm and Rhyme sessions for pre-school age children (0-4 years), an 11% increase in the number of participants and a 15% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (126,280 participants and 4,431 sessions respectively). This is also an increase of 40% in the number of participants (100,156) and a 41% increase in the number of sessions (3,608) since 2012/13.
 - 119,572 participants (54,485 adults and 65,087 children) took part in 4,009 sessions open to the public, a 9% increase in the number of participants and a 12% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (109,344 participants and 3,590 sessions respectively). This is also an increase of 34% in the number of participants (89,434) and a 31% increase in the number of sessions (3,070) since 2012/13.
 - 20,455 participants (6,087 adults and 14,368 children) took part in 1,091 dedicated sessions held exclusively for day nurseries, playgroups and parent and toddler groups etc., which represents a 21% increase in the number of participants and a 30% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (16,936 participants and 841 sessions respectively). This is also a 91% increase in the number of participants (10,722) and approximately double the number of sessions (538) since 2012/13.





Figure 6: Rhythm and Rhyme

- o 130,101 participants (57,939 adults and 72,162 children) attended 4,578 sessions that were held in the library, a 9% increase in the number of participants and a 12% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (119,021 participants and 4,101 sessions respectively). This is also a 34% increase in the number of participants (97,227) and a 33% increase in the number of sessions (3,452) since 2012/13.
- 9,926 participants (2,633 adults and 7,293 children) attended 522 sessions that took place at another location, which is a 37% increase in the number of participants and a 58% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (7,259 participants and 330 sessions respectively). This is also more than three times the number of both participants (2,929) and sessions (156) since 2012/13.

Storytime

- During 2014/15, 20,850 children engaged in a total of 2,178 Storytime sessions for 4-8 year olds, a 13% decrease in the number of children and a 3% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (24,045 children and 2,249 sessions respectively). However, it represents a 4% increase in the number of children (20,122) and a 10% increase in the number of sessions (1,978) since 2012/13.
 - o 16,362 children took part in 1,853 sessions open to the public, a 4% decrease in the number of children and a 3% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (16,992 children and 1,903 sessions respectively). This is also a 10% decrease in the number of children (18,121) and a 1% decrease in the number of sessions (1,864) since 2012/13.
 - 4,488 children took part in 325 dedicated sessions held exclusively for external organisations attended by children of an equivalent age range such as Rainbows/Cygnets/Brigíní (Girl Guides), Beavers (Boy Scouts), Explorers (Girls' Brigade), Anchor Boys (Boys' Brigade) or after school day care facilities etc., which is a 36% decrease in the number of children and a 6% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (7,053 children and 346 sessions respectively). However, this is more than double the number of children (2,001) and almost three times the number of sessions (114) since 2012/13.



- 18,334 children attended 1,992 sessions that were held in the library, a 12% decrease in the number of children and a 5% decrease in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (20,907 participants and 2,103 sessions respectively). However, this is a 6% decrease in the number of children (19,466) and a 2% increase in the number of sessions (1,957) since 2012/13.
- 2,516 children attended 186 sessions that took place at another location, which is a 20% decrease in the number of children and a 27% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (3,138 participants and 146 sessions respectively). However, this is almost four times the number of children (656) and almost nine times the number of sessions (21) since 2012/13.

Regular Activities

Genealogy

• 1,285 adults took part in 207 genealogy (i.e. family history) activities in 2014/15. This is an 11% increase in the number of adults and a 25% increase in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (1,156 adults and 165 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.


Figure 8: Genealogy (a) No. Participants [Adults] (b) No. Sessions 1,500 250 Total: 1,285 Total: 207 Total: 1.156 200 37 Total: 165 1.000 689 150 32 559 Talk/presentation Ancestry workshop 100 170 500 133 597 50 No No corresponding corresponding figures figures 0 2012/13 2013/14 2014/15 2012/13 2013/14 2014/15


- 689 adults attended talks or presentations (37 sessions), compared to 559 adults and 32 sessions in 2013/14. This is an increase of 23% in the number of adults and an increase of 16% in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15.
- 596 adults engaged in family history workshops using Ancestry Library Edition (170 sessions), compared to 597 adults and 133 sessions in 2013/14. The number of adults remains virtually unchanged but this is an increase of 28% in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15.

Go ON!

2,655 adults participated in 447 Go ON! small group sessions in 2014/15, compared to 1,757 adults and 331 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 51% increase in the number of adults and a 35% increase in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15. There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Job Clubs

- 4,159 adults engaged in 789 Job Club sessions in 2014/15, compared to 3,967 adults and 651 sessions in 2013/14. There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.
 - 3,022 adults engaged in 570 sessions held in partnership with the Department for Employment and Learning, compared to 3,967 adults and 651 sessions in 2013/14. This is a 5% increase in the number of adults and a 21% increase in the number of sessions from 2013/14 to 2014/15.
 - 1,137 adults engaged in 219 sessions held in association with other organisations (e.g. Job Assist, Kickstart to Work, Supported Employment Solutions etc.). This is the first year information was recorded for such organisations so no comparisons with 2013/14 are possible.

• 28,145 adults participated in 3,095 Knit and Natter group sessions in 2014/15. This is an increase of 22% in the number of adults and an increase of 15% in the number of sessions since 2013/14 (23,126 adults and 2,697 sessions respectively). There are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Data source and validations

Data from the Libraries NI Activity Database are used for this publication. The data are input to this system by the 96 branch library managers on a daily, weekly or monthly basis and are downloaded into MS Excel at the end of each month and then read into SPSS. Validations are carried out to ensure that the data are reliable and robust for use. Any inconsistencies or inaccuracies are reported back to the branch library managers and the data is amended where necessary. Once all amendments have been made to the data, SPSS syntax is used to produce the tables in the bulletin. Information is presented at Northern Ireland Library Authority level but further breakdowns may be available on request.
