Summary

From 1st April 2013 – 31st March 2014:

- A total of 302,117 participants (98,448 adults and 203,669 children) engaged in 19,818 core and regular activity sessions run by Libraries NI.
- 272,111 participants (68,442 adults and 203,669 children) engaged in 15,974 core activity sessions (i.e. Class visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime) this is an increase of 23% in both participant numbers and the number of core activity sessions since 2012/13 (221,109 participants and 12,993 sessions respectively).
- 30,006 adults engaged in 3,844 regular activity sessions (i.e. Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups) this is the first year information was recorded for these regular activities so there are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.

Core Activities

- 103,185 children took part in the school class visits programme (4,208 sessions), an increase of 19% in the number of children and an increase of 17% in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (86,880 children and 3,583 sessions respectively).
- 3,294 adults participated in 3,085 Got IT? sessions, compared to 2,407 adults and 2,312 sessions in 2012/13. This is an increase of 37% in the number of adults and an increase of 33% in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14.
- 15,307 participants engaged in 2,001 reading group sessions, a 33% increase in the number of participants and a 32% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (11,544 participants and 1,512 sessions respectively).
 - 10,472 adults took part in 1,268 reading group sessions, compared to 7,876 adults and 927 sessions in 2012/13. This is a 33% increase in the number of adults and a 37% increase in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14;
 - 4,835 children took part in 733 reading group sessions, compared to 3,668 children and 585 sessions in 2012/13. This is a 32% increase in the number of children and a 25% increase in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14.
- 126,280 participants (54,676 adults and 71,604 children) engaged in a total of 4,431 Rhythm and Rhyme sessions for pre-school age children (0-4 years), a 26% increase in the number of participants and a 23% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (100,156 participants and 3,608 sessions respectively).
- 24,045 children engaged in a total of 2,249 Storytime sessions for 4-8 year olds, a 19% increase in the number of children and a 14% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (20,122 children and 1,978 sessions respectively).

Regular Activities

- 1,156 adults took part in 165 genealogy (i.e. family history) activities;
- 1,757 adults participated in 331 Go ON! small group sessions;
- 3,967 adults engaged in 651 Job Club sessions;
- 23,126 adults engaged in 2,697 Knit and Natter group sessions.

Background

The Northern Ireland Library Authority (Libraries NI) was established in April 2009 as a result of the Review of Public Administration. Libraries NI has the statutory responsibility for the provision of public library services in Northern Ireland and its functions are laid down in the Libraries Act (Northern Ireland) 2008. It is a Non Departmental Public Body which reports to the Department of Culture, Arts and Leisure.

Libraries NI provides a number of core and regular activities in the majority of its 96 branch libraries as part of its programmes to promote reading, learning and access to culture, heritage and information. Core activities are defined as Class Visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime, while Regular activities are defined as Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups.

Definitions

Core Activities

Class Visits

The Class Visits programme is open to all Northern Ireland nursery, primary, post primary and special needs schools and aims to give pupils an insight into the range of services available at their local library, and to encourage them to become members. Classes can come to the library for book exchange, storytelling, craft sessions, to use computers etc.

Within the Class Visits programme, there is a set of activities specifically aimed at primary school age children in Years 4 and 6 and supports Key Stage 1 and 2 language and literacy skills as detailed in the NI Curriculum. This element of the programme offers a series of 3 one hour visits for pupils in these year groups which include a general introduction and tour of the library, activities to help explain the layout of library stock and instruction on the various uses of computers in the library. One-off visits are also available which give pupils a general overview of library services and resources. At the end of each visit, the pupils will listen to a story and there will be an opportunity for them to browse and exchange books.

Libraries NI staff have also begun outreach visits to many schools to promote the various library services and read stories to the pupils.

Got IT?

Got IT? is a free programme to support people with little or no knowledge of computers and help them develop basic IT skills. The programme is aimed at adults and delivered by Libraries NI staff on a one-to-one or small group basis, with sessions covering the following topics:

- Introduction to computers;
- Introduction to the Internet;
- Introduction to email.

Reading Groups

Reading groups cater for both children and adults and encourage people to read for pleasure, read adventurously, share their enthusiasm about books and develop the confidence to formulate and express opinions about reading.

Libraries NI staff host reading groups for adults and children/teenagers, including those aimed at specific groups in society (e.g. visually impaired, deaf etc.). Reading groups hosted by external organisations that meet in the library premises and use library resources are also facilitated.

Rhythm and Rhyme

Rhythm and Rhyme is a free programme of stories, rhymes and songs delivered on a regular or seasonal basis by Libraries NI staff (or held in partnership with SureStart¹) for parents, carers and pre-school children (aged 0-4 years). The aim of the programme is to improve children's language and communication skills before they enter formal education.

In addition to sessions that are open to the public, the programme is also available to young children attending day nurseries, playgroups, parent and toddler groups etc. These dedicated sessions are mostly held on the library premises but some are also delivered by Libraries NI staff at external locations (e.g. on playgroup premises, at community centres etc.). On occasions, public sessions are also delivered at external locations as part of community festivals etc.

Storytime

Storytime is a free programme of stories, rhymes and poems delivered on a regular or seasonal basis by Libraries NI staff for children aged 4-8 years.

In addition to sessions that are open to the public, the programme is also available to external organisations attended by children of an equivalent age range (e.g. Rainbows/Cygnets/Brigíní (Girl Guides), Beavers (Boy Scouts), Explorers (Girls' Brigade), Anchor Boys (Boys' Brigade) or after school day care facilities etc.). Such dedicated sessions are mostly held on the library premises but some are also delivered by Libraries NI staff at other locations (e.g. at community centres, church/parish halls etc. or to groups of children who are unable to come to the library, e.g. those in hospice care). On occasions, public sessions are also delivered at external locations as part of community festivals etc.

Regular Activities

Genealogy

Genealogy is also known as family history and Libraries NI holds various related free activities for adults including talks, presentations and Ancestry Library Edition workshops. Ancestry Library Edition is an online resource which can be accessed free of charge in all libraries within the Libraries NI network (i.e. it is not available to use from external locations such as homes, offices etc.) and people attending the workshops can use it, with the support of Libraries NI staff where required, to search a range of online records. These include census records which are a vital source of information for people researching their family history and allow them to discover the name, age, birth place, occupation, address etc. of their ancestors.

¹ SureStart is a government led initiative aimed at giving every child the best possible start in life and which offers a broad range of services including Early Years Care and Education to children aged 4 years and under.

<u>Go ON!</u>

Go ON! is a free programme to support people who are able to use a computer, email and the Internet and want to further develop their IT skills with regard to everyday computer tasks, such as paying utility bills or shopping online, online banking, social networking, digital photography, online health enquiries etc. The programme is aimed at adults and modules are delivered by Libraries NI staff on a small group basis.

Job Clubs

Job Clubs are held in partnership with the Department of Employment and Learning (DEL) on library premises, offering free internet access and other library services to adults who are unemployed. They give people an opportunity to develop their IT skills using the library's computers and participants receive assistance with job hunting, online applications, preparing CVs and interview practice.

Knit and Natter Groups

Knit and Natter groups are held in various libraries across Northern Ireland and are for adults who enjoy knitting, crochet, cross stitch and other crafts. They are free of charge and participants have the opportunity to share hints and tips, swap patterns, meet new people and learn new skills and can bring along whatever they are already working on or start a new project.

Libraries NI Activity Database

This bulletin presents information on participation in the aforementioned core and regular library activities during 2013/14, collected via the Libraries NI Activity Database which was established in April 2012. During 2012/13 the database collected information on core activities only but was extended to also capture information on regular activities from 2013/14.

Findings

- During 2013/14, a total of 302,117 participants (98,448 adults and 203,669 children) engaged in 19,818 core and regular activity sessions run by Libraries NI.
- 272,111 participants (68,442 adults and 203,669 children) engaged in 15,974 core activity sessions (i.e. Class visits, Got IT?, Reading Groups, Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime) in 2013/14. This is an increase of 23% in both participant numbers and the number of core activity sessions since 2012/13 (221,109 participants and 12,993 sessions respectively).





Figure 1: Core Activities (a) No. Participants [Adults + Children] (b) No. Sessions

• 30,006 adults engaged in 3,844 regular activity sessions (i.e. Genealogy, Go ON!, Job Clubs and Knit and Natter Groups) in 2013/14. This is the first year information was recorded for these regular activities so there are no corresponding figures for 2012/13.



Core Activities

Class Visits

- During 2013/14, 103,185 children took part in the school class visits programme (4,208 sessions), a 19% increase in the number of children and a 17% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (86,880 children and 3,583 sessions respectively).
 - 11,228 were pupils from nursery schools or primary schools with an associated nursery unit (399 sessions – 180 of which were outreach sessions held on school premises). This represents a 51% increase in the number of children and a 58% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (7,418 children and 252 sessions respectively).
 - 90,211 were pupils from primary or special needs schools (3,739 sessions), a 15% increase in both the number of children and sessions since 2012/13 (78,520 children and 3,247 sessions respectively);
 - 43,108 participated in a set of structured activities aimed at pupils in Year 4 & Year 6 to support Key Stage 1 & 2 of the NI curriculum with regard to language and literacy skills (1,775 sessions), a 20% increase in both the number of children and sessions since 2012/13 (35,966 children and 1,480 sessions respectively);
 - The remaining 47,103 exchanged books and/or listened to stories, took part in crafts etc. (1,964 sessions - 158 of which were outreach sessions held on school premises), which represents an 11% increase in both the number of children and sessions since 2012/13 (42,554 children and 1,767 sessions respectively);
 - 1,746 were pupils from post primary schools (70 sessions), an 85% increase in 0 the number of children and a 17% decrease in the number of sessions since 201/13 (942 children and 84 sessions respectively).




Figure 3: Class Visits

Got IT?


- 3,294 adults participated in 3,085 Got IT? sessions in 2013/14, compared to 2,407 adults and 2,312 sessions in 2012/13. This is an increase of 37% in the number of adults and an increase of 33% in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14.
 - 2,936 adults took part on a one-to-one basis compared to 2,243 in 2012/13, an increase of 31%;
 - 358 adults participated in 149 small group sessions, which is more than double both the number of adults (164) and sessions (69) since 2012/13.

Reading Groups

- During 2013/14, 15,307 participants engaged in 2,001 reading group sessions, a 33% increase in the number of participants and a 32% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (11,544 participants and 1,512 sessions respectively).
 - 10,472 adults took part in 1,268 reading group sessions, compared to 7,876 adults and 927 sessions in 2012/13. This is a 33% increase in the number of adults and a 37% increase in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14;
 - 4,835 children took part in 733 reading group sessions, compared to 3,668 children and 585 sessions in 2012/13. This is a 32% increase in the number of children and a 25% increase in the number of sessions from 2012/13 to 2013/14;
 - 1,508 children took part in 196 sessions for 7-9 year olds, a 45% increase in the number of children and a 32% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (1,041 children and 148 sessions respectively);
 - 2,395 children took part in 393 sessions for 9-11 year olds, a 30% increase in the number of children and a 22% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (1,847 children and 321 sessions respectively);
 - 932 children took part in 144 sessions for those aged 12+ years, a 19% increase in the number of children and a 24% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (780 children and 116 sessions respectively).



Rhythm and Rhyme

- During 2013/14, 126,280 participants (54,676 adults and 71,604 children) engaged in a total of 4,431 Rhythm and Rhyme sessions for pre-school age children (0-4 years), a 26% increase in the number of participants and a 23% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (100,156 participants and 3,608 sessions respectively).
 - 109,344 participants (49,789 adults and 59,555 children) took part in 3,590 sessions open to the public, a 22% increase in the number of participants and a 17% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (89,434 participants and 3,070 sessions respectively);
 - 16,936 participants (4,887 adults and 12,049 children) took part in 841 dedicated sessions held exclusively for day nurseries, playgroups and parent and toddler groups etc., which represents a 58% increase in the number of participants and a 56% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (10,722 participants and 538 sessions respectively).




Figure 6: Rhythm and Rhyme

- 119,021 participants (52,651 adults and 66,370 children) attended 4,101 sessions that were held in the library, a 22% increase in the number of participants and a 19% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (97,227 participants and 3,452 sessions respectively);
- 7,259 participants (2,025 adults and 5,234 children) attended 330 sessions that took place at another location, which is more than double both the number of participants (2,929) and sessions (156) since 2012/13.

<u>Storytime</u>

- During 2013/14, 24,045 children engaged in a total of 2,249 Storytime sessions for 4-8 year olds, a 19% increase in the number of children and a 14% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (20,122 children and 1,978 sessions respectively).
 - 16,992 children took part in 1,903 sessions open to the public, a 6% decrease in the number of children and a 2% increase in the number of sessions since 2012/13 (18,121 children and 1,864 sessions respectively);
 - 7,053 children took part in 346 dedicated sessions held exclusively for external organisations attended by children of an equivalent age range such as Rainbows/Cygnets/Brigíní (Girl Guides), Beavers (Boy Scouts), Explorers (Girls' Brigade), Anchor Boys (Boys' Brigade) or after school day care facilities etc., which is more than three times both the number of children (2,001) and the number of sessions (114) since 2012/13.




Figure 7: Storytime

- 20,907 children attended 2,103 sessions that were held in the library, a 7% increase in both the number of children and sessions since 2012/13 (19,466 participants and 1,957 sessions respectively);
- 3,138 children attended 146 sessions that took place at another location, which is more than four times the number of children (656) and more than five times the number of sessions (21) since 2012/13.

Regular Activities

From 1st April 2013 – 31st March 2014:

<u>Genealogy</u>

- 1,156 adults took part in 165 genealogy activities and of these:
 - 559 attended talks or presentations (32 sessions);
 - $\circ~$ 597 engaged in family history workshops using Ancestry Library Edition (133 sessions).

<u>Go ON!</u>

• 1,757 adults participated in 331 Go ON! small group sessions.

Job Clubs

• 3,967 adults engaged in 651 Job Club sessions.

Knit and Natter Groups

• 23,126 adults engaged in 2,697 Knit and Natter group sessions.

Data source and validations

Data from the Libraries NI Activity Database are used for this publication. The data are input to this system by the 96 branch library managers on a daily, weekly or monthly basis and are downloaded into MS Excel at the end of each month and then read into SPSS. Validations are carried out to ensure that the data are reliable and robust for use. Any inconsistencies or inaccuracies are reported back to the branch library managers and the data is amended where necessary. Once all amendments have been made to the data, SPSS syntax is used to produce the tables in the bulletin. Information is presented at Northern Ireland Library Authority level but further breakdowns may be available on request.
