

HERITAGE COLLECTION ENNISKILLEN LIBRARY





ENNISKILLEN HERITAGE holds a large collection of non-fiction and reference books relating to Irish cultural history and heritage. A major part of the collection includes locally published works, written by local authors and relating to Co. Fermanagh.

Journals/Periodicals

A significant number of historic and current County Fermanagh journals and a range of Irish titles are available for consultation - Clogher Record, The Spark, Irish Historical Studies and The Ulster Journal of Archaeology just to name a few.

Newspapers

The newspaper collection consists of local County Fermanagh newspapers - the earliest dating from 1825 up to the present day. The newspapers are available on microfilm and in hard copy. Holdings for the two current Fermanagh newspapers are as follows...

Maps

The map collection dates from the early 17th century up to and including the historical Ordnance Survey of Northern Ireland maps c.1835, c.1859,c.1907 and town plans. The Ordnance Survey Irish National Grid series c. 1968 is also available for consultation.

Ordnance Survey Parish Memoirs

Descriptions of parishes compiled in the 1830s to complement the six-inch maps.

Cuttings files

A range of Fermanagh related cuttings as well as other topics of Irish interest are covered.

Photographs

A selection of photographs on County Fermanagh from the Lawrence Collection.

Postcards

Small collection relating to County Fermanagh and all of Ireland.

Directories

Pigot's, Lowe's and Slater's for late 19th century Fermanagh. There is also a collection of Belfast and Ulster Street Directories ranging from 1955 to 1987.

Special Collections

Within the main Heritage Collection there are some smaller specialist collections reflecting different aspects of life in Ireland including Military History, W. B. Yeats, Railway History, Genealogy and Heraldry. The Dundas Collection contains material relating to the history of the Dundas family in Ireland and Scotland. The Joan Trimble Collection contains material from the library of the noted Enniskillen composer and pianist.
