It is particularly strong in relation to Irish and North American history, also local history and biography reflecting our research interests in individuals, families and localities as they relate to migration history. The collection also contains material reflecting in part the main interests of the museum in which it is located including vernacular buildings, agriculture, textiles, crafts, folklife, music, transport and museum studies.

Bookstock

The library houses over 18,000 reference only volumes. The focus of the collection is on Ireland and North America in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries

Special collections

MCMS Irish Emigration Database which contains 33,000 primary source documents on all aspects of Irish emigration to North America including ship passenger lists, emigration letters, family papers and diaries of emigrants, shipping advertisements, newspaper reports, death and marriage notices of former emigrants, birth notices of children of Irish parentage, government reports and statistics of Irish emigration to North America. The Irish Emigration Database is accessible **free** in all NI libraries through the Online Virtual Library. The database is also accessible online at www.DIPPAM.ac.uk but does **not** include the **Ship Passenger Lists**. The **Ship Passenger Lists** are available at www.rootsireland.ie (*please note a small charge will be incurred*)
