



Online Entertainment

Using your tablet, smartphone or iPad to catch up on the latest films and TV shows is a growing trend. Some packages are free, some are included with other subscriptions and some are paid either on a monthly or yearly contract. In order to view TV programmes on your device you are required to install the relevant app. In most cases the app is free to download from the App store or the Play store depending on the type of device you own. All of these apps are very similar and depending on your subscription you may be able to download programmes to watch when you are not connected to the internet.

Below is a list of some of the most popular entertainment platforms but this is not exhaustive and there are several others to choose from.

itvX	Free, although there is a Premium subscription service available if you don't want to put up with the advertisements.
Sign in to play Episode 1	All 4. You can pay £3.99 per month to go ad free with 4+ They also have a very good collection of World Drama with Walter Presents.
sky	Available to Sky customers. It is free but the service will reflect whatever television packages you are currently paying for.
	U was formerly UKTV Play. It includes channels like Dave, Drama and W. You can catch up on TV shows you've missed and find new shows.
Watch with Prime Start your 30-day free trial Auto-renews at £8.99/month after trial	This is a subscription service available to Amazon Prime members. Annual subscription is £95 after the free trial. There are some ads – there is an additional charge if you want to watch ad-free. There are other benefits, for example, free next day delivery on some products, limited use of the music service and some cloud storage.
